The Weisiger-Brown Athletics Facility was originally built in 1982, with additions in 1984 and 2006. It houses practice facilities, locker rooms, and offices for multiple team sports.

This project reconfigures the existing second floor restrooms and shower area used by the men's team sports: wrestling, soccer, cross country, and track. The project will accommodate changing team needs and includes partial reconfiguration of the restrooms and showers, including upgrades with new partitions, tile replacement, wall painting and repair, and replacement of room accessories (mirrors, towel dispensers, etc.).
