¹ N.C.G.S. §138A-15 (e): "At the beginning of any meeting of a board, the chair shall remind all members of their duty to avoid conflicts of interest and appearances of conflict under [Chapter 138A]." There is no set language required by the Act. Specific language can and should be tailored to fit the needs of each covered board as necessary.

² "A public servant shall take appropriate steps, under the particular circumstances and considering the type of proceeding involved, to remove himself or herself to the extent necessary, to protect the public interest and comply with this Chapter, from any proceeding in which the public servant's impartiality might reasonably be questioned due to the public servant's familial, personal, or financial relationship with a participant in the proceeding." See N.C.G.S. §138A-36 (c). SUBJECT: Poe Hall - Renovation

Total Project Cost	\$185,000,000

Built in 1970, Poe Hall is the primary building for the College of Education. Poe Hall has 150,982 GSF and seven levels, and will be used for teaching, research, and office space. The building envelope and interior partitions will be demolished as part of a separate project, currently underway.

This project will reconstruct the building interior to fit the College of Education's office and research needs, including general classrooms to support the campus neighborhood, and provide a new exterior envelope for the building. The renovation includes all new building infrastructure and connections to the campus utility distribution network. In addition, a major ComTech network distribution hub will be recommissioned in the building.

Poe Hall Renovation Project

The Poe Hall Renovation Project will renovate the building and restore the College of Education to normal operations after the College was displaced in 2023 due to detection of hazardous materials in the building. A separate project, Poe Hall Abatement and Selective Deconstruction, to abate the hazardous materials and deconstruct the building back to its concrete structure has previously been authorized and is currently in the Design Phase.

We seek \$3.5M for advance planning authority to refine the program, the project budget, and the schedule. Project highlights include:

- We plan to use the design-build delivery method. We feel that using the design-build delivery method will result in the most expedient and cost-effective rehabilitation of the building, allowing the College of Education to re-occupy the building as quickly as possible and resume activities critical to its mission.
- This project will build upon the existing concrete frame, providing a completely new core, a new shell that is contextually similar to neighboring buildings, and an interior upfit including classrooms; teaching and observational research labs, a library, offices and conference rooms, and gathering and study spaces.
- Exterior site improvements to ensure all entrances to the building will provide covered
 access and meet ADA requirements. Additionally, the new surrounding site will visually
 connect to the Court of North Carolina on the north side and enhance the Stinson Drive
 plaza on the south side
- A Telecommunications Network Hub for North Campus will be located on the first floor.
